President's Report to the Edison State Community College Board of Trustees June 20, 2024

> President's Office

- I had a successful trip to Washington, D.C. for Senator Sherrod Brown's Ohio College Presidents' Conference. I thanked Senator Brown for helping the College to obtain a federally directed spending grant in the amount of \$900K to fund the startup of our Respiratory Care program. I was also able to connect with Senator Brown's state director regarding additional funding opportunities for our projects.
- The Ohio Senate passed SB288, the capital appropriations bill. Edison State's regular capital funding requests were included, but our OTSCIF projects were not funded. The bill is expected to be approved by the House and signed by the Governor in late June.

> Academic and Student Affairs

- Enrollment for the Summer 2024 term is up over last year by 11.3% in credit hours and 7.5% in headcount. Thank you and great job to Rachel Carlisle and the Enrollment Management team, as well as the Advising Team, Registrar's Office, Marketing Office, and the Faculty!
- 13 cadets graduated from Edison State's Peace Officer Academy on June 18. Thank you to Commander Joe Mahan, Veronica French, and the many academy instructors for their work with these students.
- OhioLINK has awarded funding to 30 faculty from Ohio colleges in its Open Educational Resources (OER) Course Redesign Grants. The grants help instructors learn about teaching with Open Educational Resources (OER). Congratulations to Edison State's recipients: Dr. Loleta Collins and Karen Korn.
- The Physical Therapist Assistant (PTA) program received a \$1,000 mini-grant from The Edison Foundation and a \$350 grant from the General Fund of The Troy Foundation. These grants, along with departmental funds, went toward purchasing four new residual limb—wrapping models.
- Edison State recently conducted a successful manufacturing camp with 15 participants. The participants visited manufacturers in the area and completed tasks in the Edison State Engineering Lab and classrooms. Thank you to Joe Ratermann and the other faculty and staff who organized and conducted the event.
- Edison State has been announced as a sub participant under a USAID grant in partnership with the United States International University -- Africa (located in Nairobi, Kenya) to provide consulting services and support to technical colleges in Kenya as they work to build their relationships with local employers. Edison State will help the colleges to build their capacity and expertise in providing workforce development. We will receive \$728K in funding over five years to support the work of our Deans and faculty on this project. We anticipate sending a team of experts to Kenya 1-2 times per year.

- Twenty-seven student-athletes from Edison State have received Academic All-Conference honors from the Ohio Community College Athletic Conference (OCCAC) for the Spring 2024 semester. To qualify, a student-athlete must have completed at least 12 credit hours with a 3.30 GPA. Congratulations to the student athletes, coaches, and our Athletic Director, Justin McCulla on this accomplishment!
- We were saddened to learn that Edison State student, Damian Bruns, passed away on May 17. He attended Fort Loramie High School and took CCP classes at Edison State. The College expresses its deepest condolences to Damian's family and friends during this difficult time.
